**Power Parade Block "Defend Solidarity!" at the unteilbar-Demonstration
24th August 2019**

Bus Frankfurt – Dresden – Frankfurt

On the 24th August 2019 We'll Come United will join the Power Parade Block "Defend Solidarity!" at the big unteilbar-demonstration in Dresden. From the Rhein-Main region, we want to participate with as many people as possible!

How do we go to Dresden?

From Frankfurt we will travel with one bus to Dresden. The way to Dresden is long, so we have to start in the night from Friday to Saturday: Departure time is on Friday at 11:30 p.m. (in the night from 23rd to 24th of August).

On Friday evening we will have a meeting-point in Café KOZ at 9 p.m. (latest at 11 p.m.)

Place of departure:

U4 from the mainstation
(Hauptbahnhof) to stop
"Bockenheimer Warte"

We will arrive on Saturday morning around 9 a.m. in Dresden. The bus will return to Frankfurt on Saturday evening (24th August) around 9/10 p.m. and arrive in Frankfurt on Sunday (25th August) early in the morning. We will provide you with more detailed information on the departure place and time in Dresden as soon as possible. Information leaflets will be distributed on 23rd August.

Tickets/Registration

You can register for the bus Frankfurt-Dresden-Frankfurt: please contact us via E-Mail (welcome-united-ffm@web.de) or phone (01772184388). To register, we need your name and a phone number. The tickets will be sold for 10 Euro before our departure in Frankfurt.

You should take along:

Your *Ausweis*, something to drink (in the bus no alcohol is allowed!), medicine (in case you have to take medicine regularly). You can also bring a small blanket and what you need for sleeping in the bus.

Legal information for the demonstration on August 24th

In Germany everybody is allowed to attend a demonstration. It is completely legal. If you go to a demonstration or not doesn't matter in the asylum procedure. People who go to a demonstration don't have worse chance on getting a positive decision.

However it is possible that the police checks the ID cards of persons at the demonstration. Therefore you should definitely carry your documents (for example *Aufenthaltsgestattung*, *BüMA*, *Duldung*, *Aufenthaltserlaubnis*).

Probably, there won't be any problems with the police at the demo. Nevertheless a phone number will be distributed in the buses. There you can call if you unexpectedly have a problem with police during the demonstration. Then you can speak with a lawyer. But we think, that there won't be any problems.

Can everyone go to Dresden?

Most of the refugees are allowed to move freely in whole Germany. They can travel everywhere. If you only go for two days to attend the demonstration, you don't have to inform the *Ausländerbehörde*.

But some refugees have a *Residenzpflicht* (residence obligation). That means that they have to stay in the federal state where they are living, or in the town or the district where they live. They are not allowed to travel everywhere in Germany.

Residenzpflicht affects all refugees in the first three months in Germany.

Residenzpflicht affects all persons who still live in the first reception camps.

Residenzpflicht affects some persons shortly before a deportation.

Residenzpflicht affects also some persons who had problems with the police.

Or problems with *Ausländerbehörde*.

The *Ausländerbehörde* writes in the personal document of those persons that they are not allowed to move freely in Germany and to travel everywhere.

In case of *Residenzpflicht* it is written in the document: *Räumliche Beschränkung*.

Who has a residence obligation and wants to go to the demonstration to Dresden, can ask us. We then discuss together whether it is still okay to go to the demonstration in Dresden.
